

Advanced Study Course: Labour in the global economy: restructuring and resistance

Detailed description of content	<p>The changing nature of global capitalism has had dramatic consequences for labour in terms of the nature and organisation of work and workers locally and globally. In this course, we employ alternative and critical theoretical perspective to explore the interactions between labour and the changing nature of global capitalism with particular attention to the global South. We examine the changing role of labour in the international political economy focusing on transnational production, trade and finance as well as the deregulation and reregulation of labour. We also examine ways that labour has, both locally and globally, been changed by these processes and importantly, how labour is responding to these changes.</p> <p>Knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Specialised knowledge of the changing role of labour in the global political economy• Advanced knowledge of academic and methodological debates relating to the topic. <p>Skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Skills in selecting relevant theories to examine a selected area within the overall theme of labour in the global economy.• Skills in communicating and discussing theories and empirical results in connection with the seminar <p>Competencies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Competencies to take responsibility for and reflect on one's own learning and that of colleagues by actively participating in round-table discussions.• Competencies to critically, independently and creatively identify and formulate a short written assignment on the theme of labour in the global economy. <p>Assignment 1 – newspaper article based paper</p> <p>Find ONE article in an international, English-language newspaper/magazine (print or online) that focuses on labour issues. Using (some of) the concepts we have discussed in class, present and discuss the labour issue you have chosen. You are expected to use at least 2-3 readings from the course. In the assignment, you need to present your own argument. This could e.g. be</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• As juxtaposition of different perspectives/theories• A discussion of congruence or mismatch between theory/real world• A discussion of the underlying perspective of the article you're using <p>Format: max. 12.000 characters, including spaces</p> <p>Assignment 2 – paper based on the Global Labour in Denmark case</p> <p>Assignment 2 has two connected parts, a group work case study and an individual paper</p> <p>a) Group work case study – Global Labour in Denmark</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In groups, identify and research a case of 'global labour' in Denmark

- Objective: Apply (some of the) concepts we discuss in the course. This is also a good exercise for research techniques.

- Workshop (16 December) – short presentations by each group (main findings/ issues/ problems)

b) An individual exam paper.

Use your case study as a starting point for an individual academic discussion paper. You are expected to use at least 5 readings from the course.

The objective of the advanced study course is to provide the students with advanced knowledge and understanding within a specific research area covered by one of the three pillars in Global Studies: Global Politics, Global Sociology and Global Political Economy. - International public sector organisations and global governance
- Regionalisation and regional integration in international politics
- International security
- International law and human rights

Global Sociology:

- International Mobility and information flow
- International political movements and social change
- International civil society, law and defence
- Contentious identities and new global actors

Global Political Economy:

- Work and globalization
- Natural resources and geopolitics
- Trade, investment and global production networks
- International Financial Economics

Teaching and working methods	The courses are based on lectures, but will also include other teaching and working methods such as group work, exercises, student presentations, peer feedback and field trips or guest lectures as well as other practical activities.

Form of examination (p1)	<p>Individual written portfolio.</p> <p>The portfolio consists of 2 written products, that wholly or partially are developed during the course. For example, products can be exercise responses, speech papers for presentations, written feedback, reflection, written assignments. The preparation of the products may be subject to time limits.</p> <p>The character limit: maximum 28,800 characters, including spaces. The character limits include the cover, table of contents, bibliography, figures and other illustrations, but exclude any appendices.</p> <p>The portfolio's specific products and the (if relevant) recommended size (character limit) for the individual products are made public on study.ruc.dk before the course begins.</p> <p>The entire portfolio must be handed in at the same time.
