ACADEMIC CONTENT

Overall objective

This is a lecture-based course covering Pathophysiology and Immunology

In the pathophysiology part the students have to learn and deduce the relevant knowledge in the physiology of various human diseases, including blood and vascular diseases, cardiovascular diseases, respiratory diseases, diseases of the stomach, liver and pancreas, kidney diseases and the salt and water imbalance, endocrine gland diseases, diseases of musculoskeletal diseases, in the nervous system as well as pain and trauma.

The immunology part: The relevant knowledge in the structure of the immune system, antibody production, the MHC complex, T cell functions, abnormal immune responses, immunological techniques, and their uses will be educated and deduced.

Detailed description of content

Themes in the pathophysiology part:

Various human diseases:

- Blood and vascular diseases,
- Cardiovascular diseases.
- Respiratory diseases
- Diseases of the stomach, liver and pancreas,
- Kidney diseases and the salt and water imbalance
- Endocrine gland diseases
- Diseases of musculoskeletal diseases, in the nervous system as well as pain and trauma.

Clinical cases will for the different diseases will presented and case-based teaching on the diseases will be included.

Themes in the immunology part:

- structures of the immune system
- antibody production
- the MHC complex
- T cell functions
- abnormal immune responses
- immunological techniques

Overall plan and expected work effort

This is a lecture-based course covering Pathophysiology and Immunology

ASSESSMENT

Form of examination

Individual written invigilated exam.

The duration of the exam is 5 hours.

Type of examination in special cases

Examination and assessment criteria

Regular exam:

5hrs written exam in two parts: a immunology part and pathology part. Immunology part is handed in after 1.5 hrs of the exam.

The pathophysiology part weighs 70 % of the exam, immunology part 30%.

Reexam is oral with preparation time. The examination is based on two questions in pathophysiology and one in immunology.

The student starts the exam with short presentations covering the questions, after which the examination takes place as a dialogue. The entire syllabus can be used for the examination.

It will be assessed to which degree the student demonstrates to ability to:

- identify and describe pathophysiological conditions in the human organism as well as in various tissues.
- identify and describe the structure and function of the immune system
- discuss how experiments have contributed to the current understanding of pathophysiology and immunology
- describe the development of various diseases
- explain how diseases are diagnosed and can be treated.
- access basis clinical data from patient cases to identify diseases and treatment options.

The assessment of the oral re-exam is based on the student's ability to meet the criteria mentioned above and their ability to clearly present and communicate the given topics
